A team on paper and a team on the field are, sometimes, two different animals.

Henry knew that the Bridgrooms, Pastime Club, and Beaneaters were the strongest teams starting the season – and depending on only 16 games to mean much wasn't wise. But Henry knew something else.

When a team drops 14 of 16 games to start the season in a league that only plays 98

games, it becomes a mathematical problem. Assuming the future Coover Cup winner has to win about 60 games to be competitive, that would mean the Bridegrooms (the team in question here) would have to finish their last 82 games at 58-24, an unlikely scenario.

Given that reality, Henry looked at his other two teams.

The Pastime Club was 9-7 and only 2 games out, while the Beaneaters were 8-8 and 3 games behind. Both teams were certainly in striking distance.

The Haymakers (1st), Excelsiors (2nd), and Keystones (3rd) were all Second Tier teams, although there could be a surprise in there somewhere.

But Henry was thinking it's likely going to be the Pastime Club. He actually felt sorry for the Brides...

Things were straightening themselves out – to a point at least. The Bridegrooms marched to an 18-10 record in June, now 6 games off first instead of 9. 3B Ben Trimble led that charge with a .430/.469/.590 slash line.

There was some disappointment that Ben didn't get the Hitter of the Month award (went to Omar Reyes), but Trimble

put it simply, "Omar hit 17 triples in June and stole 29 bases so far this year. I can't be upset about that."

Although the Pioneers had dropped to 7th (20-24), the other three teams Henry had predicted to do well were in 2nd, 4th, and 6th (with the Bridegrooms on a march).

44 games down, and 54 games to go.

There wasn't much room for teams to stay in a slump for long, or on the other side of that same coin, a quick collection of wins at some point in the season could put you in a great spot to win The Cup.

Henry understood the odds against the Bridegrooms. Even with an 18-10 June, they still had to finish the season with a 40-14 run to get the 60 wins they would need to be close. It wasn't going to happen.

In 15 games, Woodman hit .473 with no home runs, 9 RBIs and scored 12 runs.

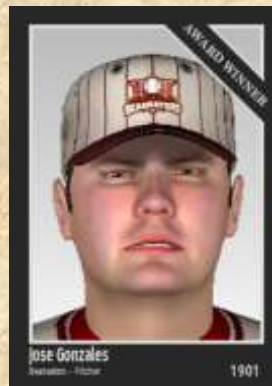
Tim Treadway Named Pitcher of the Month in May: Keystones
